

Practically all of my work is in criminal law.

As a Sexual Assault Defense Unit specialty team member, all of my cases involve allegations of sexual abuse and all are set for jury trials in the Eighth Judicial District Court.

State of Nevada v. Hector Jardine, District Court Case No: C-223240 (2006)

This matter was a criminal case heard in the Eighth Judicial District Court (Judge Jackie Glass – Ret.) in which the defendant was charged with several counts of Attempt Murder with Use of a Deadly Weapon, Sexual Assault, First Degree Kidnapping, and Burglary. Mr. Jardine was convicted on nearly every count charged; however, I consider the matter to be one of my "significant" cases because it is the first case in which I served as lead counsel and achieved an acquittal. The jury found Mr. Jardine not guilty on one count of Sexual Assault. Given the disturbing medical details of the case, an acquittal on any aspect was a major success in my view and it suggested that there may have been a credibility disconnect between the complaining witness and the jury. For me, the case also represents one of the occasions in a defense attorney's career where, in order to be effective and carry out a very difficult duty, one must separate his or her emotions from the task and fight zealously within the rules of the law. It is the only way that our justice system, one in which Americans take such great pride, can work.

Sheriff v. Witzenburg, 122 Nev. 1056 (2006)

This case serves as my exemplar of the Public Defender's Office policy of "vertical representation." I represented Mr. Witzenburg from preliminary hearing in Justice Court, to my argument before the en banc Nevada Supreme Court. At preliminary hearing, the issue of the State's use of out of state witness affidavits under NRS 171.197 was key. I challenged that statute citing a violation of my client's 6th Amendment right to confrontation under the Supreme Court case of Crawford v. Washington. Former Justice Court Judge James Bixler ruled that the State would be allowed to use those out of state affidavits during the preliminary hearing. Mr. Witzenburg's case was bound up to District Court - Department VIII, where I challenged the legality of his confinement in a petition for a writ of habeas corpus. In granting the petition, Judge Gates (Ret.) ruled that the Crawford opinion applied to preliminary hearings the same as it did at the trial stage of a criminal case. The State appealed Judge Gates' ruling to the Nevada Supreme Court where I argued for the Respondent before the Court, en banc. The Supreme Court reversed Judge Gates' ruling and I believe that the Witzenburg case currently stands as a landmark in Nevada in 6th Amendment jurisprudence.

State v. Kentro Taylor, District Court Case No: C-209609 (2005)

This matter was a criminal case heard in the Eighth Judicial District Court (Judge Lee Gates) in which the defendant was charged with several counts of Attempt Murder with Use of a Deadly Weapon, Stop Required on Signal of a Police Officer, Conspiracy to Commit Murder, Possession of Stolen Property, and Ex-Felon in Possession of a Firearm. Mr. Taylor's case received an almost unprecedented level of media coverage for a case that did not involve a death. My client, Taylor, along with his girlfriend, April Jones, became involved in a high speed chase with Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Officers during which Jones fired several rounds from an assault rifle at the pursuing policemen. During opening statements, the lead prosecutor mentioned that Mr. Taylor was wanted for murder in the state of Louisiana. This, what the DA's office referred to as a "slip of the tongue," was in direct violation of an order from a motion in limine that I filed prior to trial to prevent any such

improper bad act evidence from being introduced. Although the Court denied my motion for a mistrial, it did grant my motion for new trial following Mr. Taylor's conviction. The Nevada Supreme Court affirmed Judge Gates' order granting the new trial.

State v. Michael Davis Harmon, District Court Case No: C-251300 (2010)

This matter was a criminal case heard in the Eighth Judicial District Court (Judge Jackie Glass) in which the defendant was charged with multiple counts of Lewdness with a Child under 14 and Sexual Assault with a Child under 14. Had my client been convicted of any one of those Category A offenses, he would have been sentenced to at least 10 years to Life in prison. I inherited the case following the withdrawal of a very well-known, capable, and highly respected criminal defense attorney who, like deputy Public Defenders on the SADU, still handles a high volume of these difficult child-sex cases. Also, the Harmon case was my first jury trial as a member of the Sexual Assault Defense Unit. There was no preliminary hearing because Mr. Harmon had waived his right to a preliminary hearing in Justice Court on the acceptance of a plea bargain offer from the District Attorney. At arraignment, however, Michael decided that he would not spend the meaningful remainder of his life in prison for something he did not do.

After a withering five-day trial - and prior to that, several days of motions, counter-motions, hearings, arguments, and an investigation that covered the states of Utah, Oregon, Colorado and Nevada - we (my second-chair was Mr. Abel Yanez who, not long after <u>Harmon</u>, started his own law firm) achieved a stunning result for our client - NOT GUILTY ON ALL COUNTS!

Gregory A. Williams v. The State of Nevada, 134 Nev., Advance Opinion 83 (Issued 25 October 2018)

This case serves as another sterling example of the Public Defender's Office policy of "vertical representation" working in a way that achieved equal justice, even for a poor Nevadan accused of the most heinous crimes. I represented Mr. Williams from preliminary hearing in Justice Court following his arrest, to my argument before the en banc Nevada Supreme Court in February of this year. Because the district court failed to properly engage in the three-step Batson inquiry during jury selection, and because it erred in determining whether to admit or exclude key evidence discovered in the course of my investigation of the case at trial, Mr. Williams' wrongful conviction on nine Category A felonies was unanimously reversed and his case remanded to the district court for retrial - in a published decision!

I was an applicant for the open seat in Las Vegas Justice Court – Department 4 in 2006. Although I reached the final interview stage of the process, Judge Melissa Saragosa was ultimately appointed to fill the position.

I also applied to fill the vacancy in Dept. XX of the Eighth Judicial District Court in 2015. Judge Joe Hardy was ultimately appointed to fill the position.

More recently, I applied to fill the vacancy in Dept. 3 of the Nevada Court of Appeals left after Justice A. Silver's election to the Nevada Supreme Court. After interviewing with the Commission on Judicial Selection, I was notified that my application would not be passed on to Governor Sisolak. Thereafter, in the winter of 2019, I applied to fill the vacancy left in Dept. IX from Judge Togliatti's retirement. The Selection Commission chose another applicant.

In 2020, I ran in the non-partisan primary as a candidate for district court judge (Eighth Judicial District Court – Family Division, Dept. Z). This was my first attempt at running for public office and despite being significantly out-spent by the other candidates, I

received nearly 47,000 votes along with the endorsement of the Clark County Black Caucus. Unfortunately, I did not advance to the general election.

I am certain that there will be a crowded field of applicants for the open seat on the Eighth

Judicial District Court – Department XI. Many of those other attorneys will no doubt have several more years of experience in the practice of law than the seventeen years in this jurisdiction that I would bring to the bench. However, I am absolutely confident that I am the best candidate for this position despite these apparent circumstances that may, at first blush, seem to put me at a great disadvantage against my competitors.

First, throughout my academic career, my involvement and list of achievements as a student can be placed against any other that the Commission might review. Since middle school, I have been a leader in athletic competition, extra-curricular activities, student government, community service, patriotism, and the performing arts. These experiences were critical in my development as a young man and ultimately as an attorney where the lessons of preparation, team-work, effort, and competitive spirit have served me well. My family taught me from an early age that talent alone is not enough and that at every new level of growth that I might reach in life, there will be others who will have more gifts than I. This is why achievement was stressed so heavily in my childhood home. My mother often said that when a person works to set himself apart as the best in whatever he chooses to pursue, he can look back on a life of extraordinary achievement and be proud in knowing that there may have been others who were better, but who may not have worked as hard. Lately, I've seen t-shirts, coffee mugs, etc., printed with the slogan, "...hard work beats talent when talent doesn't work hard," and had a good laugh with mother about the publishing royalties that she may be missing out on in her retirement.

I am also a firm believer in the value of community service. While I certainly did not grow up wealthy, I was fortunate to have two working parents who made sure that I understood that my lot in life was indeed blessed. I have carried those lessons of compassion and charity into my professional work as an attorney for the poor and often despised members of our society. As a deputy public defender I have

seen the damage that the lack of a solid family support system, little education, drug and alcohol abuse, mental illness, disease, and still, sadly, racial prejudice, can do to a person. I often ask my clients if they have ever known a positive male role model or an African American attorney. Before the pandemic, many would say that they had not until meeting me in the detention center. This is why community outreach has been so important to me throughout my life and I still believe that members of the local judiciary should be eager to speak to young people and to be visible public servants in the community. I am prepared to do just that if I receive the appointment to fill the vacancy left by Judge Gonzalez.

I am not ashamed to say that I believe it is critically important for young African Americans,

Latinos, Asian Americans and other minorities to see another person of color on the bench and with them
in the community. That presence sends the message that their government exists not just to humiliate,
detain, punish and cast them aside, but to provide care, protection and opportunities for them and the
people they love. Judges are supposed to help citizens of all colors understand that the law, when
adjudicated with fairness and equality in mind, works for them and that neither the seats of power and
authority in government, nor the privileges of safety, freedom, good health and prosperity are the
birthright of only the wealthy.

My experience in the Eighth Judicial District Court has more than adequately prepared me for the challenges that are sure to face a new judge. I am confident that I can quickly grasp the intricacies of civil law that I have gotten away from in my career these past several years. I served as the Judicial Law Clerk for Judge Stewart L. Bell back when his department handled civil cases exclusively and I worked in a construction defect law firm before joining the Public Defender's Office. If appointed, I will seek the advice and counsel of my more senior colleagues in presiding over criminal and civil matters and I am willing to do whatever it takes to make sure that at the end of the day, the work is done and done well regardless of any natural or technological challenges that we may face as a branch of government.

Finally, I do not believe that my relative youth in the field is something that should be overlooked completely. Rather, I view this opportunity in my career as one where I can do a great deal of good for the people of Clark County and one in which I can use my vigor, strength and presence as a tool in achieving the court's goals for many years to come. I also very strongly believe that our judiciary should not be comprised almost exclusively of former prosecutors. All officers of the court who report to work every

States and that of the state of Nevada, along with our state's own laws, ordinances and regulations. Throughout my career I have upheld that most solemn vow to deal squarely and honestly, and I have treated every courtroom adversary, presiding judge, law enforcement officer and staff person with integrity, courtesy, dignity and respect. The difference is that I am also obligated to protect the rights and best interests of the weakest persons in our society. I have spent virtually my entire adult life in this state's service and I believe that our Nevada would be greatly diminished if the branch of government charged with interpreting the law ever became an ideological monolith that only comprehends justice from a single point of view. My record in school, in the professional world and in the legal field is comparable to anyone's, on either side. And what I may lack in "time in," I believe that I have more than compensated for in achievement and commitment to the values of equal justice under law that make our system the best in the world.

I ask that the Commission give my application careful and thoughtful consideration. In the end, I am sure that Governor Sisolak and the people of Southern Nevada will find that they have discovered a truly special individual who is ready and willing to listen to them, to protect them, and I will treasure such an awesome honor for the rest of my life.
