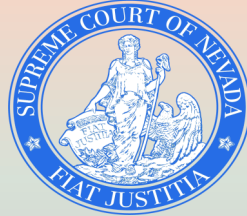

In 2015, his program "You Can't Stop What You Don't Know™" was highlighted in the book, *Clearing the Haze* by Dr. Christian Thurstone and Christine Tatum.

Mr. Mark Lundholm came from humble beginnings on the streets of Oakland, California, as a homeless criminal, mental patient, to a world-renowned entertainer, and his humor is a wild ride of challenges, changes and 2nd chances. Just out of rehab, while performing a 20 Minute comedy routine at San Quentin State Prison, Mark discovered his childhood survival skill of making people laugh was his ticket out. Armed with plenty of material poking fun at the insanity his life had become, Lundholm has worked his way up - literally from the gutter. It was not long before Mark garnered the attention of Showtime Comedy, and was given his own special. These routines quickly gained widespread attention. Ultimately Mark's entire story was produced and an off-Broadway play called “Addicted... a comedy of substance” was born. “Addicted” is quickly making its way around the world. Already in Chicago, Miami, New York, Denver, San Francisco and Nashville, 2011 brings even more – launching “Addicted” in Los Angeles, London and Germany!

Having performed in all 50 States and 10 foreign countries, including appearances on Comedy Central, Showtime, A&E, NBC, and CBS, Mark Lundholm's pure, dark look at his past, and clever glimpses of the future make this funny man one of the best. Mark has been hailed as “a younger George Carlin” by the *Contra-Costa Times*, and *The New York Times* called him “Riveting... Dark and Funny!” *The San Francisco Chronicle* said he was “Funny. Douglas B. Marlowe, J.D., Ph.D. is a senior scientific consultant for the NADCP, senior science and policy advisor for Alcohol Monitoring Systems, and CE training consultant for the Global Institute of Forensic Research. Previously, he was the chief of science, law, and policy for NADCP, director of law and ethics research at the Treatment Research Institute, and adjunct associate professor of psychiatry at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. A lawyer and clinical psychologist, Dr. Marlowe has received numerous research grants to study coercion in substance use disorder treatment, the effects of drug courts and other diversion programs for individuals with behavioral health disorders involved in the criminal justice system, and behavioral treatments for persons with substance use disorders and criminal involvement.

Dr. Marlowe is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association (APA) and the College of Physicians of Philadelphia and has received proficiency certification in the treatment of psychoactive substance use disorders from the APA College of Professional Psychology. He has published over 175 journal articles, monographs, books, and book chapters on the topics of correctional rehabilitation, forensic psychology, and treatment of substance use disorders.

Chief Judge Kim McGinnis, Pueblo of Pojoaque, earned a Ph.D. in neuropharmacology from the University of Michigan in 1999 and completed a postdoctoral fellowship at Massachusetts General Hospital, Department of Neurology, Molecular Neurogenetics Unit. Detroit Legal Aid and Defenders as a felony-level public defender. In 2008, she became an assistant defender with the Michigan State Appellate Defender Office, where she served as the principal appellate attorney investigating convictions tainted by Detroit Crime Lab malfeasance. In 2011, she moved to Taos, New Mexico, and practiced domestic relations law, primarily representing victims of domestic violence and sexual assault in state and tribal courts. The Pueblo of Pojoaque Tribal Council appointed her associate judge in 2013 and chief judge in 2015. Judge McGinnis presides over Pojoaque's Path to Wellness Courts and is project director for Pojoaque's Sober Living/Re-Entry Project. She is a certified handler of ADW Kiki, the Pueblo of Pojoaque Tribal Court's service-trained courthouse facility dog.

Mr. Dan Mistak, M.S., M.A., J.D., serves as director of Health Care Initiatives for Justice-Involved Individuals at Community Oriented Correctional Health Services, and aims to connect community systems of care to improved health care behind the walls of the jail. In addition to working to change long-standing inequities by improving health and justice policy, he has been a trial attorney and worked with justice-involved individuals regarding the collateral consequences of their justice involvement. Mr. Mistak established the first medical–legal partnership for victims of crime and justice-involved individuals in the U.S. He holds a juris doctorate from the UC Berkeley School of Law and master’s degrees in genetics/cell biology and philosophy from Washington State University. He is admitted to practice law in California and Hawaii.

Mr. Sam Quinones is a Los Angeles-based freelance journalist, a reporter for 35 years, and author of four acclaimed books of narrative nonfiction. He is a veteran reporter on immigration, gangs, drug trafficking, the border. Mr. Quinones is formerly a reporter with the L.A. Times, where he worked for 10 years. Before that, he made a living as a freelance writer residing in Mexico for a decade. His latest book, released in November 2021, is *The Least of Us: True Tales of America and Hope in the Time of Fentanyl and Meth*. In this book (published October 2021), Mr. Quinones chronicles the emergence of a drug-trafficking world producing massive supplies of dope cheaper and deadlier than ever, marketing to the population of addicts created by the nation's opioid epidemic, as the backdrop to tales of Americans’ quiet attempts to recover community through simple acts of helping the vulnerable. *The Least of Us* was nominated for a National Book Critics Circle (NBCC) award for Best Nonfiction Book of 2021 in January 2022.

The Least of Us follows his landmark *Dreamland: The True Tale of America's Opiate Epidemic* (Bloomsbury, 2015), which ignited awareness of the epidemic that has cost the United States hundreds of thousands of lives and become deadliest drug scourge in the nation’s history. Along with many other awards and recognitions, *Dreamland* won a National Book Critics Circle award for the Best Nonfiction Book of 2015. In 2019, *Dreamland* was selected as one the Best 10 True-Crime Books of all time based on lists, surveys, and ratings of more than 90 million Goodread.com readers. Also in 2019, Slate.com selected *Dreamland* as one of the 50 best nonfiction books of the last 25 years. His first two books grew from his 10 years living and working as a freelance writer in Mexico (1994-2004). *True Tales From Another Mexico: The Lynch Mob, the Popsicle Kings, Chalino and the Bronx* was released in 2001. In 2007, he came out with *Antonio's Gun and Delfino's Dream: True Tales of Mexican Migration*. Mr. Quinones ends the collection in a chapter called "Leaving Mexico" with his harrowing tangle with the Narco-Mennonites of Chihuahua.

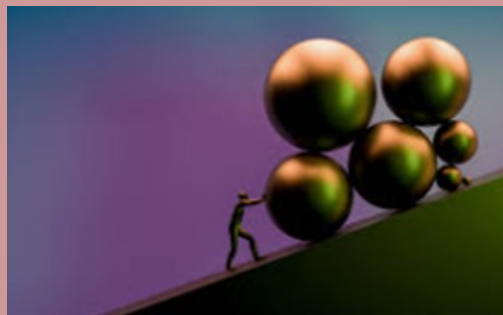

Travel Claims

The Supreme Court of Nevada, AOC Accounting Unit will, upon receipt, process your Claim for Travel Expense form for reimbursement. If the original Claim for Travel Expense form is complete, accurate, and includes required receipts, you should receive your reimbursement within seven (7) business days. [DOWNLOAD THE TRAVEL CLAIM PDF FORM HERE](#)



NEW PROCEDURE: The Travel Claim will ONLY be accepted in electronic form at the request of the AOC Accounting Unit. We will be unable to accept paper travel claims on site. If you have any questions prior to submitting your Claim for Travel Expense, please contact the AOC Accounting Unit at judicialbranchtravel@nvcourts.nv.gov.

Note: When in doubt as to whether a cost incurred during travel status can be reimbursed, keep an itemized receipt, claim the cost on the Claim for Travel Expense form, and submit the receipt with the claim. The AOC Accounting Unit will notify you if the expense claimed is allowable for reimbursement under current [Per Diem Rates](#) and the [Supreme Court Travel Policy](#).

Conference Attendance:

In order to receive reimbursement, you will need to attend at least 75% of the conference that you are requesting reimbursement for.

Lodging:

Only the group rate plus tax, resort and tourism fees are reimbursable. Submission of the original hotel receipt must accompany your Claim for Travel Expense form.

New Vendor Registration Policy (non-State of Nevada employee attendee):

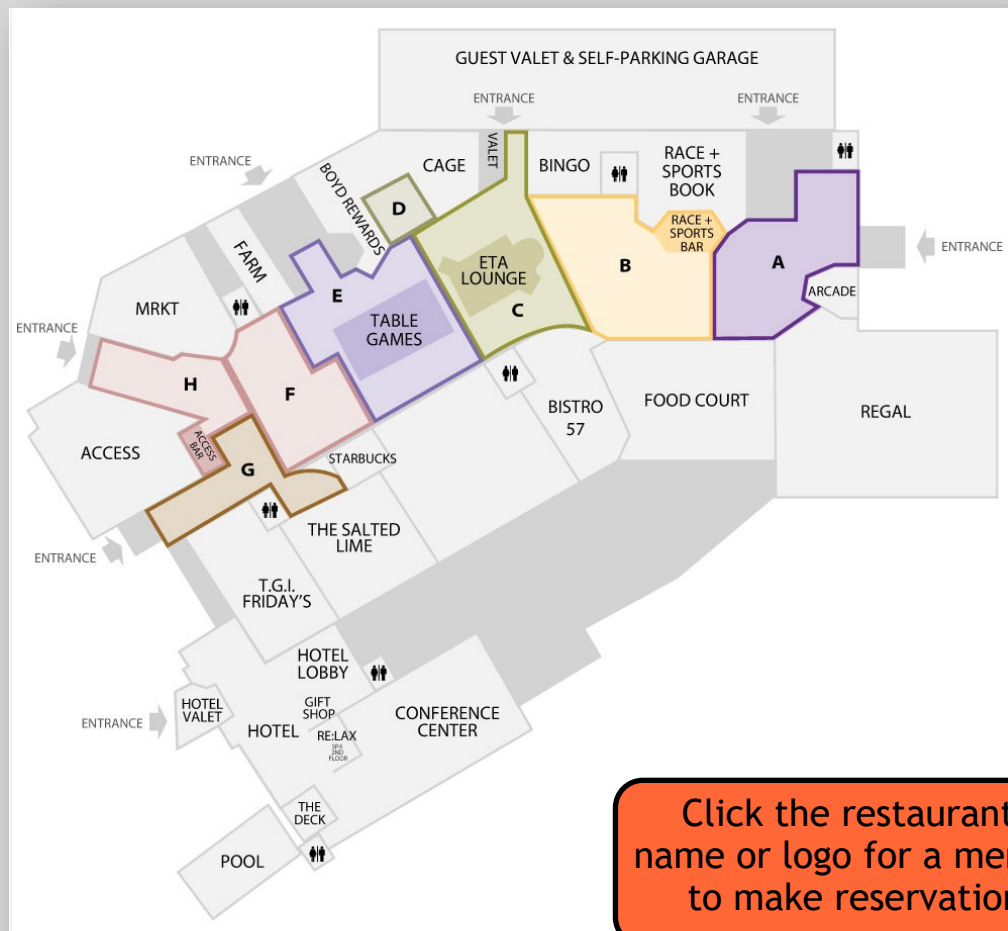
NRS 227.185 requires, among other things, that all persons who get a payment from the State, e.g., travel reimbursement for education, receive that payment via electronic funds transfer (EFT). Should you anticipate claiming travel or related expenses for the *Nevada Specialty Court 2022 Conference*, please take a moment now to register for electronic payment with the State using the [Electronic Vendor Registration Form \(New Payees\)](#). This will enable us to process your claim upon receipt. It takes approximately 4 weeks to establish your vendor account. Please be sure to include a voided check and fax or mail the form along with the voided check to the Nevada State Controller's Office. Note: If you currently receive payments from the State via EFT, no further action is required.
